# "Dear God: Will You Forgive Me?"

# Psalm 51

<sup>1</sup>Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions. <sup>2</sup> Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin!<sup>3</sup> For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me. <sup>4</sup> Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight, so that you may be justified in your words and blameless in your judgment. <sup>5</sup> Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin did my mother conceive me. <sup>6</sup> Behold, you delight in truth in the inward being, and you teach me wisdom in the secret heart. <sup>7</sup> Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow. 8 Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones that you have broken rejoice. 9 Hide your face from my sins, and blot out all my iniquities. <sup>10</sup> Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me. <sup>11</sup> Cast me not away from your presence, and take not your Holy Spirit from me. <sup>12</sup> Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and uphold me with a willing spirit. <sup>13</sup> Then I will teach transgressors your ways, and sinners will return to you. <sup>14</sup> Deliver me from bloodquiltiness, O God, O God of my salvation and my tongue will sing aloud of your righteousness. <sup>15</sup> O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise. <sup>16</sup> For you will not delight in sacrifice, or I would give it; you will not be pleased with a burnt offering. <sup>17</sup> The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise. <sup>18</sup> Do good to Zion in your good pleasure; build up the walls of Jerusalem; <sup>19</sup> then will you delight in right sacrifices, in burnt offerings and whole burnt offerings; then bulls will be offered on your altar.

The nature of the "imperative" request

Implied when asked of a superior:

#### Why we need to ask for forgiveness

#### "Have mercy on me, O God ... "

(Steps to <u>re-new</u> a right spirit and come clean spiritually)

1. Re .

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"...according to your steadfast love...your abundant mercy..." (v. 1)

# 2. Re \_\_\_\_\_.

"For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me..." (v. 3)

"I acknowledged my sin ...and I did not cover up my iniquity. I said, 'I will confess my transgressions to the LORD,' and you forgave the iniquity of my sin." (Psalm 32:5)

# 3. Re \_\_\_\_\_\_.

"Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin!" (v. 3)

"Cleanse me...wash me...blot out all my iniquity." (vs. 7, 9)

"Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me..." (v. 10)

4 Re \_\_\_\_\_.

"Then I will teach transgressors your ways...and my mouth will declare your praise." (vs. 13, 15)

# 5. Re \_\_\_\_\_.

"The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit, a broken and contrite heat, O God, you will not despise." (v. 17)
